On January 20, 2017, BJMC organised a guest lecture on Writing for Media and Radio Reporting for first and second year students in the Nelson Mandela Auditorium. The Speaker was Prof. Pradeep Mathur, who is a member of Advisory Board of DME and former Head of Academics at IIMC.

Our Principal Academics, Prof. Vikram Dutt had felicitated and gave a brief introduction of Prof. Mathur to students. Prof. Mathur discussed the job opportunities in Print and Radio Journalism, importance of writing and required tools for reporting. He also discussed the challenges that prevail in the media industry'. The main objective of the lecture was to inculcate the habit of improvisation among students so that they can communicate and write well while working in mainstream media.
