8th October 2021 ABHIVYAKTI

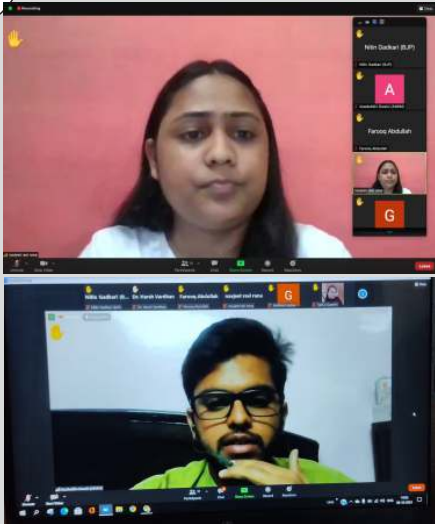
Abhivyakti: Literary and Debating Society of Delhi Metropolitan Education, Noida (GGSPIU), organized an online mock parliament on 08th October, 2021 on the topic "*Should India recognize rule of Taliban as a government of Afghanistan?*". The event was carried out under the guidance of Mr. Mohit Kishore Vatsa, judged by Mr. Manish Dhankani of (BA LLB 5A), Mr. Raj Singh (BA LLB 3B) was the Convenor of the event and Mr. Shashwat Bhardwaj (BA LLB 2B) was the Co-Ordinator. The event commenced at 2:30 pm on the Zoom platform. The aim of this mock parliament was to enhance the debating skills and verbal ability of students. The event saw active student participation. A Mock Parliament is a simulation of the parliamentary proceedings of a legislature or other deliberative assembly on a particular topic. The aim of Abhivyakti in organizing this event was to develop an insight into the working of Parliament amongst the students and to

make students consider public issues of dire importance and form their opinion to the matter.

There was a total of 20 Parliamentary Portfolios, such as that of Mr. Narendra Modi, Mr. Amit Shah, Ms. Sonia Gandhi, Dr. Farooq Abdullah and out of all following motions that were raised in, two consecutive Parliament sessions, two were selected as the Motion of the sessions:

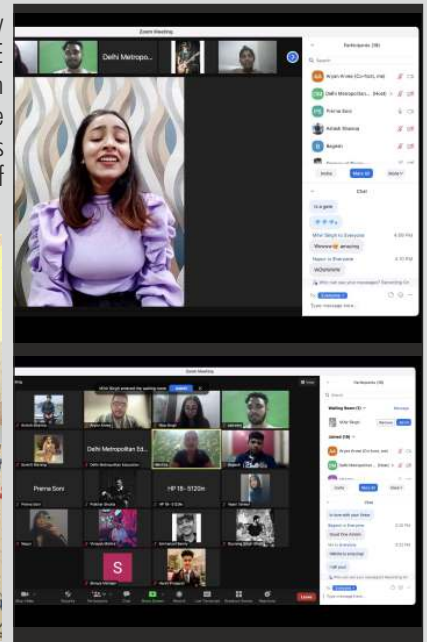
