# Converting Summer Internship to Case Study

Since an internship report is written by a person who has already had field exposure in his respective subject of study, it is prepared in a professional-looking format. The proficiency of an internship report, thus, determines the efficiency of the submitting party. DME Management School in collaboration with the Centre for Management Research organized a lecture on 'Converting Summer Internship to Case Study' on 2th November, 2021 at 02:30 pm through zoom platform. The session was taken by Dr. Shalini Gautam, Associate Professor, DMS and Head, DME Outreach. This crucial session was attended by faculty members and students of DME Management School. Dr. Gautam in her opening statement mentioned that "The internship report is viewed as a theoretical and methodologically oriented work of description and reflection on the activities carried out within the scope of an internship in organisations".

Ma'am discussed that the structure of an internship report has a set of core elements that must be taken into account in its preparation. Firstly, it should include an introduction, which puts forth the reasons for the choice and importance of the topic, the objectives, a brief description of the organisation where the internship was carried out, a brief presentation of the theoretical and methodological option followed as well as a brief presentation of the report's chapters. Another central element are the theoretical and methodological underpinnings, which set out the theoretical perspective adopted to frame the description of the organisation, the context and the activities developed in the internship and the presentation and discussion of the methodological options, namely, the research strategy, methods, observation instruments and data collection and treatment procedures. She also mentioned that while converting the internship report into case study, current data and figures should be given more importance than long past information. The attendees were given many tips by Ms. Gautam on how to adopt various strategies that can be used to ensure an effective and efficient work path that ensures the quality of the . Ma'am urged the students to have vision and passion in order to fly high in the sky. Her enthusiasm and continuous interaction, kept all students engaged throughout the session.

The event came to close with the vote of thanks by Ms.Roli Wadhwa, Assistant Professor, DMS whereby she thanked the speaker for such an informative and interactive session.

# Global Strategic Management Conference (GSMC, 2021)

As we move ahead, let us have a crisp summary and the road ahead emanating from the seven-day intriguing consortium, GSMC 2021. This year's conference theme was Workplace Digitalisation-Challenges, Opportunities and Future Trends.

Day one - The Inaugural Ceremony was in the framework as an HR Conclave, dedicated to distinguished and Eminent HR Heads, from Industry including Mr. Rajeev Bhaudaria, Managing Partner, Ebullient, Ms Gauri Das, Vice President, and Head HR, India Factoring and Finance Solutions Private Limited and Mr. Manoj Kumar Chaudhary Head- Human Resources at Edelweiss Asset Management where deliberations on Role of HR in Workplace Digitalisation were conducted.

The following days of the Conference consisted of master classes and paper presentations by participants on the sub-themes of the conference. We witnessed very encouraging response from academia and industry regarding the themes and sub-themes of the conference.

A total of 50 abstracts were received for the conference out of which 30 papers were selected for presentation in the 4 technical sessions, namely FINTECH, chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Nagendrakumar Nagaligam, Srilanka; MARKTECH, chaired by Dr. Shad Ahmad Khan, Oman; HRTECH chaired by Dr. Sean Watts, Canada, and EDTECH chaired Dr. Farah Naqvi, Kuwait. On the concluding day, to keep the wheels of learning& deliberation rolling, we had the IT Conclave unveiling the pertinent Role of IT in Workplace Digitalisation which was graced by several dignitaries, namely Hon. Mr. Justice Bhanwar Singh (Director General, DME), Mr. Aman Sahni (Vice Chairman, DME), Prof. (Dr.) Ravikant Swami (Director, DME), Prof (Dr.) Poorva Ranjan (Head, DME Management School), Mr. Hemant Sahal (Founder & CEO, CollPoll), Mr. Mukesh Dube (General Manager and Global Head, Cyber Security Operations Netsurion Technologies, Florida), Mr. Bharath Vasudevan (Senior Vice- President, Head Of Capability, BPS Tech Mahindra) along with three Master Class Speakers Dr. Farah Naqvi (Faculty – HR and OB, GCUE, Kuwait), Dr. Shah Ahmad Khan (Asst. Prof, Buraimi, Oman) and Prof. (Dr.) Nagendra Kumar Nagalingam, Associate Dean, SLIIT Business School, Sri Lanka).

A panel discussion was also organized during the day which was moderated by Dr. Seema Mam (Convenor GSMC 2021) and Dr. Pooja Sharma (Co - Convenor GSMC 2021). All the speakers made it very clear that digital workspace connects people beyond the boundaries of their geographies or departments. # **Industrial Visit to Mother Dairy**

To build a bridge between academics and industry, DME introduces its students to the professional world and make them proactive to face the challenges that may emerge in their career. Industrial visit is a part of educational tour that provides students with an opportunity to learn practically throughout interaction, working method and employment practices.

DME Management School organized an industrial visit to Mother Dairy, Patparganj, New Delhi on 22-23 November 2021 for students of BBA, 2020-23 batch. This plant deals in production of about 10 lakh litres of token milk (out of 31 lakh of total milk) and other dairy products distribution in Delhi and NCR on daily basis. The students got excited and curious after reaching at Mother Dairy plant. They were directed to conference room where they were welcomed. Thereafter, the students were apprised about the mission, vision and operations of the company through a presentation as well a brief introduction of white revolution movement. The mother dairy official also shared the information regarding the unforgettable support provided by former Prime Minister Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Ji in uplifting growth and leading a transparent system in the milk production in our country. The students were also told about how they are helping the farmers as 80% of the total revenue generated goes back to the farmer. The instructor also demonstrated the milk processing (Cleaning, Homogenization, Standardization and Pasteurization) by Video Clips.

This was a great way to learn about the milk production process in such a renowned plant and to get exposure about the transformation process including inbound and outbound logistics. Inbound logistics is about how milk is collected from the farmers followed by strict quality assurance mechanism where the milk samples undergo 29 quality control tests (mainly comprising of adulterants, temperature, taste, fragrance and weight). Outbound logistics is about how the processed milk is transported using thermally isolated milk tankers that are equipped with GPS system managed by central control room.

The students were shown some adulterant test, cleaning of milk transport tankers and large SILO containers (having one lakh liter capacity each). They gave the information about importance of milk (mainly for teenagers and working class) and its composition about all the milk varieties (token, toned, full cream and skimmed milk) based on its fat and SNF (Solid Not Fat) and there are to be used by different age group people. They took the students to a room where fully automatic human operated cleaniser, homogenizer, pasteurizer machines were present. Finally, on the completion of the tour, the appetite was duly taken care with fresh flavored milk and ice creams.
