Celebrating the essence of drama as an art form, Taabiir, Theatre Society of Delhi Metropolitan Education, organised a monologue competition titled Aks on February 7 in the virtual mode, in which students from various colleges participated.

Shraddha Goyal, Student President, Taabiir introduced the competition and its rules, followed by an opening address from Dr Ambrish Saxena, Professor and Dean, DME Media School. He reminisced his passion for theatre as a college student and said, "Our team consistently won the first prize in several street play competitions. It was a thrilling experience." Prior to the program, 20 participants were shortlisted from a total of 136 entries. Their performances were evaluated by a team of judges on the parameters of dialogue delivery, body language, and expressions. Ms Medhavi, Assistant Professor, DME Media School, one of the judges of the event, explained the fundamental dos and don'ts of acting. She remarked that originality and creativity are essential. "Keep this in mind that people want to watch new things and not retakes of what has already been done," she advised. Ms Priyanka Sharma, Eminent actor & director joined the program as its judge along with Ms Abhishree Srivastava, DME alumna and founding member of Taabiir. After watching the performances, Ms Sharma offered insights about camera management during online competitions. She said, "You must keep your camera in a way that captures you from the best angle." Ms Srivastava recalled her time in DME and thanked the team for reviving her memories of Taabiir. Later, Dr Susmita Bala, Professor and Head, DME Media School, addressed the gathering. She suggested that student societies must take initiative to organize more such events. "These are the opportunities for them to learn and work." Dr Ravikant Swami, Director, DME, talked about the ability of theatre to encapsulate precise emotions. He then announced the results compiled by the judges. Chetan Garg from PGDAV College, University of Delhi bagged the first position while Satyendu Verma and Purvi Dhupar from Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, University of Delhi were awarded the second and third positions respectively. The session concluded with a vote of thanks by Anish Dhawan, Student Secretary, Taabiir.

The programme started with the opening address by Dr Ambrish Saxena, Dean, DME Media School, "Radio has always been a medium for connecting people much before the internet and television came into existence. Great singers like Late Lata Mangeshkar, Kishore Kumar etc. had radio as their partner during the tough phases of their career and even during the war times of Indo-China, Kargil etc." Adding to the same, Dr Sushmita Bala, Professor and Head, DME Media School, while



describing how Radio is an essential part of our daily lives stated, "Radio has no boundaries, and connects the masses together in the most authentic manner. All India Radio (AIR) along with other Radio Stations have given us many great memories which most of us always recall from our childhood days". The event commenced with the first programme which was a Song Request Show hosted by Ms Ananya Verma, a student of second year, BJMC, in which she played a few songs requested by the audience attending the event shared through a Google Form. The next programme was a Guest Interview hosted by Ms Yashika Aggarwal, a student of third year, BJMC. This session was graced by Ms. Poonam Srivastava, Radio Presenter, Gold Channel, All India Radio and Ms. Garima, Ex Radio Jockey (Red FM 93.5, Radio One 94.3). Ms. Poonam motivated the students as she described the experience of going on air, "In this Digital Age, where there are so many alternatives for entertainment, people are still passionate about radio and haven't forgotten the values. The Mic becomes your best friend when you become a radio presenter. I still get nervous when I begin a programme on air despite of being a presenter since decades, and maybe that is the beauty of this medium".
