


The session was followed by Q&A round wherein the students clarified their doubts.


The training also provided guaranteed placement support and certificate after completion.


Corporate Readiness Week (BBA Batch 2020-23)

that an extra dose of enthusiasm never hurt anybody. She emphasised on the importance of courage as she believes that it takes courage to do anything in life. Ma'am suggested a few books as well to the students.Ms. Shammi Duggal — Co-Founder at myJen.ai- makes artificial intelligent products for Communication Skills. She talked about the importance of finding beauty in various cultures. Lastly, Ms. Sujata Mehta -Founder & Editor in Chief at Eduvoice.in.concluded by mentioning one simple principle of her like-"Never give up in your life"

Professional Courses at GGSIPU-Series of Webinars in Schools



The Invisible' by Anna Marry and Ellie Suttle.


Limit - The short documentary directed by Debasish Mazumder.


Many students shared their lived experiences during Covid lockdown, role of small invisible things making a larger impact in lives, and what bit they do individually and collectively to help building a sustainable society.
