A meeting was held on December 1, 2022 in Room 10 to conduct the auditions for Radio Intersect at 3 pm. 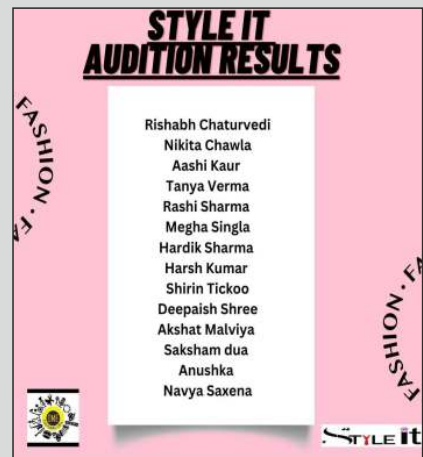
There was a debate competition organised by Abhivyakti: Literary and Debating Society on the topic "Incendiary Media V. Human Rights In Conflict Zone". Ms Varsha Chandra judged the debate. Ma'am has completed her B. A (Hons) in Political science from Jesus and Mary College, Delhi. She has also done her M.A. in Political Science from Arts Faculty, at Delhi university. She has an experience of 9 years and 11 months as ADDL. LAW OFFICER, LAW COMMISSION OF INDIA. The debate was well organised and the participants quoted very good points in favour and against the motion. The points raised in the favour of the mass media in its role as saviour of human rights are like the media is authoritative by its right to freedom and speech mentioned in section 19(1)(a) so that it can reach the rest of the world unbiased and portray the actual condition of the people which is barely reachable to us. Participants also mentioned the drawback of the absence of media by adding that in the 1980s when the press was restrained from writing or showing anything about the Kashmiri Pandit's situation and the exodus in Kashmir causing people to suffer and justice become difficult to be given to them by punishing the terrorist like Yasser Malik who escaped during that time. Russian and Ukraine war was one search away and at the fingertips of the public, which cautioned the public about the happening of third world war if not the latter not stopped in time, and the countries were more active in resolving the issues between Russia and Ukraine so that the innocents do not face it and due to the media, the Indian government was pressurized to call the

Indian students back from the war zone safely. While the points stated against media are as media misuse its rights and provoke the community as well as the speakers called for the debate on their platform for extracting viewership and showcasing the heavily edited content and manipulating the reality of the content. Media instead of protecting the victim and their privacy, show the faces of the victim, tell their household addresses, and infringe on their right to privacy while practising their right to freedom of speech. Media can also be seen as biased as it works in favour of the political party and helps them grab vote banks by praising them and sugar-coating the news in their favour. Media also does not pick up the right topic for the discussion and tries to pull out hatred among the public after building any propaganda like Hindu-Muslim. Instead of, analysing government policies and figuring out the errors in them, they pay heed to the topic like Deepika Padukone wore this kind of attire during her NCB interrogation. While concluding the event the participants were asked about the solution to the current issues and a unanimous point came out that the media should stop manipulation and start making a good world. Ms Varsha Chandra, at the end of the session, gave insights about the topic and suggested the participants do the research work from books and authenticated sources like online libraries. She even recommended some of the guidelines to the budding lawyers about the format, how to be with female colleagues and maintain a decorum healthy work-life. Her presence inspired the students to work for women's rights and their empowerment.
